CSR procedures are intended to maximize students' involvement and support student success in heterogeneous, or mixed learning level, classrooms. Participants will learn to teach the core components of CSR (before, during, and after reading strategies); facilitate student-led textbased discussions; use CSR to support students with diverse learning needs including English language learners in heterogeneous classrooms; and plan for successful integration of CSR into existing structures.
