DIALOGIC READING AS A TIER ONE INTERVENTION IN A PRE-K RTI MODEL

Description: Dialogic reading is an interactive storybook reading technique based on the work of Dr. Grover Whitehurst, Dr. Christopher Lonigan, and the Stony Brook Reading and Language Project. A key assumption of dialogic reading is that children learn most from books when they are actively involved. Dialogic reading makes use of picture book reading strategies designed to increase oral language abilities, and later reading proficiency in young children. It can be used effectively within the context of Tier One or Core Instruction within a Response to Intervention model at the preschool level. Strand #9 provides sufficient information regarding Dialogic Reading for practitioners to begin using it in their classroom. A follow-up webinar session allows teachers or others an opportunity to receive feedback from the presenter regarding their implementation efforts.

Intended Audience: *Dialogic Reading as a Tier One Intervention in a Prek Rtl Model* is intended for teachers, administrators, and support staff who provide instruction and support to young children at the Prek level.


